Te Ara Tangata - The Pathway of the People

You may have noticed a new sign outside The Stables, here's the story behind it courtesy of the KCDC Projects and Comms Team:

Council has worked closely with Te Ātiawa Town Centres Working Group since 2018 to improve the Waikanae town centre, integrate the marae into the town centre, and to embed the cultural identity, history, and heritage of Te Ātiawa ki Whakarongotai.

The 'Te Ara Tangata' pathway is very significant to iwi because it's the route

from Whakarongotai marae to Ruakōhatu whanau Urupā (cemetery), which is located next to St Luke's Church on Pehi Kupa Street. It was also the original entry and exit laneway to the marae.

Te Ātiawa ki Whakarongotai requested the name change and received support from several groups including nearby landowners. Council Officers researched the origins of the naming of Frater Lane and were unable to find any relevant records. It is likely the lane was named after Dr Alec Frater, MBE, who served as Waikanae's only doctor between 1964 and 1971, operating from a surgery based on Frater Lane.

Te Ātiawa Town Centres Working Group supports recognising Dr Frater's contribution to Waikanae by using his name on an appropriate memorial.

With all the interest in the Waikanae Pop-Up Village, we'd like to clarify that this initiative is entirely led and managed by Kāpiti Coast District Council's Strategic Development Team.

The Waikanae Business Association was invited to some discussions and provided input on the project. However, the final decisions were made by the Council and we have not had any say in how the project has been implemented.

That said, we support the concept as a way to provide much-needed retail space for new businesses and community groups, helping them raise their profiles while bringing fresh energy to our Main Road.

We have shared recommendations with KCDC, including ensuring that new tenants do not compete directly with existing businesses and that the process remains fair and transparent.

We look forward to seeing the space take shape and hope it brings positive benefits to the Waikanae community and local businesses.

We're inviting expressions of interest from those keen to lease a pop-up space—whether you're starting out and looking to test the market or an existing business wanting to expand. Community groups wanting to share their interests, hold exhibitions or sales are very welcome too. Our goal is to create a vibrant hub that complements the offerings around Mahara Place and the Main Road.

Also, keep an eye out for an upcoming public art project that will involve and celebrate our community.
